

OLD BASING ARCHERS - CLUB TROPHIES AND COMPETITIONS

ARCHER SUPREME - awarded at the discretion of the committee in recognition of outstanding contribution to archery during the year. Award is made at the AGM in February for the previous year's efforts.

Trophy for Winner.

ST GEORGE TROPHY- shot on nearest appropriate Sunday to St George's Day (23rd April). Rounds shot relate to First Class distances - Gents-St George; Ladies and Boys of 16 plus-Albion; Juniors-Windsor.

Trophy for Recurve and Compound Winners, medals for 1, 2 & 3.

HANDICAP LADDER CHALLENGE- Shot from 1st May to Club Championships to promote competitive internal club shooting. Works on individual challenges by members with current handicaps. Challenges can be given and received at Club Target Days (refer to club rules) and External Tournaments.

Trophy for Winner, medals for 1, 2 & 3.

HANDICAP TOURNAMENT- Windsor round for all members with current handicap, shot as club birthday shoot in August

Trophy for Winner, medals for 1, 2 & 3.

WAND SHOOT- After and at shortest distance of Handicap shoot. Wand is narrow strip of cloth down centre of boss. Most hits, 18 arrows, Handicap Tournament winner may not win Wand trophy.

Trophy for Winner, medals for 1, 2 & 3.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS - Shot on the first Sunday in October. Traditional York, Hereford, Bristol rounds as required. Individual competitions as follow:

Club Champion Gentleman - Trophy for Champion, medals for 1, 2 & 3.

Club Champion Lady - Trophy for Champion, medals for 1, 2 & 3.

Club Champion Junior - Trophy for Champion, medals for 1, 2 & 3.

Club Champion Compound - Trophy for Champion, medals for 1, 2 & 3.

Club Champion - Longbow - Trophy for Champion, medals for 1, 2 & 3.

Club Champion - Veteran - Top archer over 60 years of age. Trophy for Champion, medals for 1, 2 & 3.

Bunkle Rose Bowl - Highest dozen score at the longest distance - recurve only.

Selman Tankard - Highest dozen score at the longest distance - compound only.

Hanley Salver - awarded to an otherwise unrewarded archer at the organiser's discretion.

Brooks Trophy - awarded to the archer who shoots closest to a hidden score determined by the committee (e.g. half of the highest score of the day).

Best Gold - at last half dozen of longest distance, any bow category. Medal to winner.

Colour Prizes - prize to individual colour winners, any bow category.

INDOOR PORTSMOUTH COMPETITION - awarded to the best archer overall (in all bow categories) in the designated Portsmouth Rounds. Calculated as the aggregated score - actual score plus handicap allowance on the day. Each month the winner is awarded 5 points, second 4 points down to fifth 1 point. The archer with the most points at the end of season is the winner. Shot on the First Wednesday of each month at either the OBA indoor evening sessions or the daytime session at Andover.

Trophy for Winner, medals 1, 2, & 3.

FROSTBITE COMPETITION - awarded to the best archer overall (in all bow categories) in the designated Frostbite Rounds. Calculated as the aggregated score - actual score plus handicap allowance on the day. Each month the winner is awarded 5 points, second 4 points down to fifth 1 point. The archer with the most points at the end of the season is the winner. Shot **only at the 10.00 session** on the first Saturday of each month.

Trophy for Winner, medals for 1, 2 & 3.

POSTAL PORTSMOUTH and FROSTBITE - team competitions based on scores from the rounds shot in the club competitions. In exceptional circumstances these rounds can be shot one week later.

WESTERN 7.2K COMPETITION. - may be shot at any time during the summer: any Western may be included (i.e. New Western, Long Western and Western). Archers score is added to their current handicap allowance. Each archer's best five scores constitute their total for the year. (i.e. 7200 if they shot to handicap)

Trophy for winner, medals for 1, 2, & 3.
