Indoor Shooting

This is underway on Wednesday evenings, 8:30 - 10:00, in the village hall. The fee is £25 for the term (11 weeks) or £4 per night for occasional visits.

The first Wednesday of each month is the crucial one, the club indoor Portsmouth round competition is shot then. This tournament relies on handicaps to determine the winner, so get

down and shoot some rounds to establish an indoor handicap and then improve on it.

Frostbite Competition

As the weather closes in we still like to see some activity at the recreation ground. Therefore the first Saturday of each month is designated for the Frostbite round. There is a club competition and the best scores are entered for a postal league. We shoot in almost any conditions (except howling gales), so get your wellies and waterproofs ready.

A Frostbite round comprises 3 dozen arrows, 3 each end, at 30 meters onto the smaller (80cm) target face. Scoring is metric (10 zone) i.e. inner gold is 10, outer 9, inner red 8 etc.
