The fees remain unchanged from last year at:

Adult @ £60 each, OAPs @ £50 each, Juniors @ £40 each.

Family discounts (provided at least one child is included) are 10% for parent and child, 18% for three or more members of the same family.

Adult GNAS/SCAS/HAA fee is  $\pounds$ 31, Junior fee is  $\pounds$ 17.50.

Adults not resident, or formally resident, in Old Basing must also pay the parish levy of  $\pounds 5$ .
