The Coaching Group would like to nominate for this year's award one of its longest serving and most highly respected County Coaches.


It is difficult to be precise about exactly how long his service to archery extends but we are reliably informed that it is in excess of 30 years.

He also worked for a number of years on the National Youth Squad staff.

So highly regarded in his own club is he that some years ago they awarded him Honorary Presidential status and despite this dizzying accolade he continues to be a constant and reliable worker for the club who presents a prestigious front for one of Hampshire's leading clubs.

His work for the nationally renowned Andoba FITA Star is also well known.

G -Whizz!

Did you know:

- That 'a body in a state of rest' has the force of 1G or, one times the 'force of gravity' acting upon it.
- A white knuckle ride at a theme park produces about 2-3G for its rider.
- A F1 racing driver experiences up to 4G on a banked turn.
- At 5-6G during aerobatics in an aircraft, a person may lose consciousness for a short while. Not healthy when you are driving!
- A fighter pilot fitted with a pressure G-suite to restrict blood flow away from his brain and into the lower limbs, can withstand up to 9G in a sustained high G turn, without losing consciousness.
- A competition aerobatic pilot can withstand up to 14G for a couple of seconds during a violent and severe manoeuvre.
- A test pilot, strapped to a rocket sled, once survived 40G when it was decelerated when breaking, by means of a water trough. His internal organs were displaced!
- A human, falling 50mtrs into water would not survive the 60G impact.
- An arrow accelerates up to 8,000G across the bow, and experiences 40,000G when it hits the target.

What does this tell us? Never try to stop an arrow when it's in a hurry! Dave S

This year, our practice evening as moved to Monday. This is so that the beginners' week-day classes can be held on Thursday and so avoids the disruption of the Bank Holidays.




